



Webinar Launch for New Indigenous Art Resource

Please register for the August 18th webinar launch of Culture Inspires Art – featuring First Nations, Métis and Inuit artists. This resource includes how-to art videos along with a teacher resource. Special thanks to the Institute for Catholic Education for partnering with us to create this excellent resource.

The contributions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit artists featured in the video series reflect their culture, inspiration and express their ideas, feelings, beliefs and values through their artistic expression.



Through guided exploration, students are encouraged to practice skills using a variety of tools and art mediums to create their own art pieces that express their own thinking and spontaneity.

The series of four videos includes:

- Tammy King, a Mohawk artist, who uses vibrant paints to create a painting that
 encompasses the richness of her culture. Her inspiration is taken from the Legend of
 the No Face Doll.
- Sylvia Tennisco, an Algonquin artist, uses vivid colours to create an acrylic painting featuring the silhouette of a bear. For the Algonquin people, fishing and hunting are an important part of their culture.
- Jaime Morse, a Cree-Métis/Michif artist, explains fish-scale art and how she creates flowers.
- Saelym DeGrandpré, an Inuit artist, describes print making to create beautiful art pieces featuring animals or characters from Inuit legends.
